
ALEJANDRO MORENO ' MEN'S SOCCER STUDENT-ATHLETE

Alejandro Moreno was a four-year letterwinner and starter for the men's soccer program from 1998-2001 helping the Spartans record a 57-27-3 record (.672) during his career. He was a four-time First Team All-Region selection and a four-time All-Conference recipient.

Moreno is the fourth all-time leading scorer in program history with 155 career points (goals and assists). He is fourth in program history with 65 goals and 11th with 25 career assists. He led the Spartans in goals all four years of his career scoring 20 as a freshman, 19 as a sophomore, 15 as a junior and 11 as a senior. His 45 points scored in 1998 rank the 11th most in a single-season in program history.

Moreno helped the Spartans to a Southern Conference regular season and Tournament Championship in 1998 as UNCG advanced to the NCAA Second Round. His play led the Spartans to a No. 13 ranking in the country by the NSCAA and a 17th ranking by Soccer America. He earned SoCon All-Tournament accolades three times in his career.



Moreno was selected 27th overall in the 2002 Major League Soccer (MLS) Super Draft by the Los Angeles Galaxy. He played in 272 career MLS games with six different teams from 2002-2012. He also played for the Venezuela National Team during his career, including games during the 2010 World Cup Qualifying round.
